Delivery <ul style="list-style-type: none">➤ Appropriate volume and rate➤ Speech is varied to show emphasis and interest➤ Appropriate posture, eye contact, facial expressions and gestures➤ Language choice directly and clearly presents topic	
Content <ul style="list-style-type: none">➤ Clear and consistent focus with appropriate transitions between main ideas➤ Speaker demonstrates substantial knowledge of subject➤ Main ideas are clearly supported through research➤ Speaker effectively communicates content to audience	
Organization <ul style="list-style-type: none">➤ Organized with appropriate beginning, body, and conclusion➤ Speech organization is clear and logically sequenced➤ Exhibits research by use of various supporting materials➤ Message is clearly presented

Skill/Talent <ul style="list-style-type: none">➤ Skillful use of material or medium➤ Reflects attention to detail and quality craftsmanship➤ Shows careful preparation and practice

Calculating an Overall Grade for Project Presentation, Product, and Journal

1. Average the scores that individual teachers gave for each scoring guide;
2. Multiply the average scores by these factors:

A. Presentation Score x 3

B. Product/Performance Score x 3

C. Journal Score x 1

3. Add together and divide by 7.

Equal weight (3/7) is given to Presentation and Product/Performance; a much lower weight (1/7) is given for the Journal component.
